ABOUT DHAKUAKHANA COLLEGE



In 1966, Dhakuakhana College was established in the Lakhimpur district of Assam, India, as a result of public donations from the community. The history of the college represents the sincere and passionate aspirations of the people of Dhakuakhana, where the majority of the population belong to the underprivileged Scheduled Tribes, Scheduled Castes, and other backward groups. The college is affiliated to the Dibrugarh University, Dibrugarh and recognized by the UGC under sections 2(f) and 12(B).

The college was taken under Deficit system of Grant in Aid in 1975 and brought under the provincialized system by the Government of Assam in December 2005. It offers undergraduate programmes in Science, Social Science and Humanities having fourteen departments. The college also operates a study centre for distance education i.e., under Krishna Kanta Handique State Open University (KKHSOU) and Distance and Online Education under Dibrugarh University. The 14.95acre big campus is having the requisite infrastructures- the administrative building, well equipped Library and classrooms, laboratories, playground, Boys and Girls Hostel, the canteen and other basic amenities. With a sanctioned faculty strength of 47 teaching and 24 non-teaching, the college strives to provide new knowledge to its students.

The Institution also believes in establishing new courses to equip students in the changing scenario and to meet the need of the local society. The college organizes various community reach out programs through its NSS Unit and other forums, collaborates NGOs and civic forums. It aims to introduce courses on entrepreneurship development and looking forward to partner with the industry and other entrepreneurs.

ABOUT CENTRAL LIBRARY



Central Library of Dhakuakhana College is one of the renowned libraries present in Dhakuakhana. It is regarded as the hub of knowledge for its collection varieties; which is of around 18000+ printed volumes consisting of textbooks, general books, rare books and references primarily in Assamese and English. It also has subscribed to nine numbers of reputed peer-reviewed journals and also provides access to numerous e-journals and e-books. The central library has also subscribed to magazines (monthly) and Newspapers (daily) in both Assamese and English language. Moreover, it is primarily recognized for holding collections of local history and skill development books. Since 2015, the library has been automated using Soul ILS, INFLIBNET, and as of last February 2022, it has been upgraded to Soul 3.0 ILS software. Since then, the entire collection of the library has been readily accessible in a machine-readable catalogue. In addition, users can search the computerized bibliographic data of the collection using Web OPAC on the Local Area Network (intranet) in provided the computer systems inside the library premises or through library website.

Additionally, this library has been a part of NLIST since 2018 in order to give its patrons the best possible access to online information. Moreover, it is also a member of National Digital Library of India club, primarily known as NDLI club, providing online access to over 99 lac digital resources in various regional languages of India. And with the aid of a barcode-based automated circulation system, users can receive lending services in no time. The library features an orientation programme for every newly added student for all academic departments. Above all, the library is exceedingly user-friendly and accessible to those with disabilities.

OBJECTIVES OF THE CENTRAL LIBRARY OF DHAKUAKHANA COLLEGE

The Central library has certain objectives based on which library facilities and services are planned, acquired, organized, and then delivered. These are-

- 1. To create a conducive platform for accessing the knowledge repositories for the information seekers through the five fundamental laws of library science.
- 2. To merge the library through library and information standard with other higher educational institutions, R&D organization, world class super highway information and learning centres.
- 3. To meet and serve the invisible users irrespective of the geographical barriers apart from the walk-in users.
- 4. To trace more and more knowledge sources among the information pollutants
- 5. To create a digital environment through the process of E-learning.
- 6. To work for all those activities where the users of the library feel its information expectations.

LIBRARY SERVICES

The college library provides all the basic services to its clientele in additions to some of the advanced services. The main services provided by the library are

- Library Automation: The Central Library is fully computerized and students can access
 the books located within the library. Moreover, all the transaction of the library is
 maintained through the Integrate Library Management System Software (ILMS) called
 SOUL 3.O.
- 2. WebOpac: The Central Library also provides the facilities to search for books using online public access catalogue through the automation software SOUL 3.0.
- 3. Digital Library: Central Library has built the Digital library system which acts as a platform for e-learning using the software D-Space 4.2. Students can browse the digitized documents like old questions papers, local history of the region and academic publication through the Digital Library systems of the college. Moreover, open access e-resources like books, journals, etc. also can be accessible.
- 4. *E-resources:* the library caters to the needs of the 21st century learning resources, basically the e-resources. Students can access 195809+ e-books and 6293+ e-journals of NLIST programme of the INFLIBNET (Information and Library Network), Ahmedabad. The students can collect the username and password from the office of the librarian, and can access it from anywhere and at any time.
- 5. **NDLI Club:** The central library has undertaken the initiative to provide e-resources through National Digital Library of India (NDLI) and also be a successful club member of NDLI to encourage the students to participate in different events, competitions and programmes organized by different institution all across the country.
- 6. OR Code Based Question Paper Service: The Central Library of Dhakuakhana College provides another optional service for the students to acquire the previous year question paper. This facility encourages the students to have a clear vision regarding the question pattern of the previous semesters.
- 7. **Top Library User:** The Central Library of Dhakuakhana College provides a ranking of top library user posting in the College Website as well as in the library notice board.
- 8. Internet Access: Students and staff can access the internet facility in the library during the library hours.




Figure 1: Month-wise Student Attendance Record (Source: Data acquired from Library Footfall System log report)




Figure 1: Month-wise Employees Attendance Record (Source: Data acquired from Library Footfall System log report)
